A NRRA Cooperative Recycling Program



Fluorescent Bulbs, Dry-Cell Batteries, Ballasts, Thermostats and other mercury-containing devices are high volume, easily recognizable items that contain a small amount of mercury. If broken, mismanaged or disposed of improperly, the mercury could contaminate soil, air, groundwater, and/or surface water and also cause serious health problems. The Northeast Resource Recovery Association (NRRA) has two easy-to-use programs (“Store N’ Ship” and “Bulk” Pick-Up) to help its members efficiently, economically and environmentally recycle these items!

PROGRAM DETAILS



- ♻️ Contact NRRA for information about the “Bulk” Pick-Up recycling program
- ♻️ NRRA will order small or large boxes and/or fiber drums for storage of your materials, which will be delivered to your facility/office
- ♻️ Reuse clean and intact fluorescent bulb boxes that come in to your facility/business - our vendor encourages reuse
- ♻️ Store Fluorescent Bulbs and other items in the appropriate “Bulk” storage containers in a clean, dry area
- ♻️ Contact NRRA to coordinate pick up of the collected Fluorescent Bulbs and other items at your recycling facility

What happens to the Bulbs, Batteries, Ballasts, Thermostats and other mercury containing devices recycled through NRRA?

These items are processed to separate into components of glass, metal, and mercury and are recycled or incinerated responsibly by our vendors.
