



CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS



A NRRA Cooperative Recycling Program



Up to 20% of a community's waste can be "Construction & Demolition Debris" (C&D)! With a cost potentially lower than waste disposal, recycling C&D debris through the Northeast Resource Recovery Association (NRRA) can save tax dollars and conserves valuable landfill space. Recycled "C&D" debris is processed to recover wood chips used for fuel at wood burning energy plants, aggregates for use as road base and dirt fines used for daily cover at landfills.

PROGRAM DETAILS

- ♻️ Contact NRRA to sign up for the C&D program and receive current pricing information
- ♻️ Choose how the "C&D" will be stored at the facility (i.e., on the ground in a simple bunker or in a container)
- ♻️ Arrange for transportation - Need assistance in arranging trucking? Contact NRRA
- ♻️ Decide if residents will be charged a fee for disposing of "C&D" - (Listing of fees charged by NH communities is available by contacting NRRA)
- ♻️ Contact NRRA to coordinate delivery or pick up of the "C&D" for recycling

* Loads of C&D material sent to market for recycling, that have 25% or more unacceptable materials, will be charged a higher per ton price than the standard recycling rate. Load acceptability is determined by the vendor's inspectors.
