



FLUORESCENT BULBS “STORE N’ SHIP” PROGRAM



A NRRA Cooperative Recycling Program

Fluorescent Bulbs, Dry-Cell Batteries, Ballasts, Thermostats and other mercury-containing devices are high volume, easily recognizable items that contain a small amount of mercury. If broken, mismanaged or disposed of improperly, the mercury could contaminate soil, air, groundwater, and/or surface water and also cause serious health problems. The Northeast Resource Recovery Association (NRRA) has two easy-to-use programs (“Store N’ Ship” and “Bulk” Pick-Up) to help its members efficiently, economically and environmentally recycle these items!

PROGRAM DETAILS

- ♻️ Contact NRRA for information about the Pre-Paid “Store N’ Ship” recycling program
- ♻️ NRRA will order your Pre-Paid “Store N’ Ship” boxes and/or pails, which will be mailed to your facility/office
- ♻️ When “Store N’ Ship” boxes are full, simply attach the enclosed FedEx shipping label to the box and/or pail and contact FedEx directly to arrange for a pick-up - please have pre-paid label and the quantity to be shipped ready



Pre-Paid “Store N’ Ship” Bulb Recycling Program

RECOMMENDED USERS:	Members with limited storage capacity and/or that generate small volumes of Fluorescent Bulbs, Dry-Cell Batteries, Ballasts, Thermostats and other mercury-containing devices
PROGRAM LOGISTICS:	Members pre-purchase “Store N’ Ship” boxes/pails through NRRA. The cost includes the container, shipping, and recycling of the enclosed materials. (IMPORTANT: NEVER store these items outside where they can be exposed to weather)

What happens to the Bulbs, Batteries, Ballasts, Thermostats and other mercury-containing devices recycled through NRRA?

These items are processed to separate into components of glass, metal, and mercury and are recycled or incinerated responsibly by our vendors.
