Thanks to Lucas, funding was procured, and his school district has had an active and productive sustainability committee ever since.

Lucas is a young environmentalist. He is knowledgeable about the importance of local farming, helps to plant and weed the school gardens, and is a fine example for encouraging classmates to also get involved. He can regularly be found talking with his peers and describes in simple terms how anyone can turn their waste into a reusable soil amendment, compost.

This year in eighth grade at Oyster River Middle School in Durham New Hampshire, Lucas decided to make another video, this one solely about composting. Lucas spoke to students, teachers, community members, and interviewed Rian Bedard of the Mr. Fox Composting Company, to help him determine how he could best relate and educate a broad audience about compost. Lucas is passionate about saving the environment. Lucas has taken the initiative to get involved in sustainable concepts. Lucas has been able to make others aware about compost. Lucas' video is an educational and lasting viewing piece to teach us the simplicities of composting. Lucas has been able to impress on many that by composting they are helping to reduce large quantities of good resources which previously were filling our landfills.

For these reasons we are pleased to have Lucas Schroeder as the 2013-2014 New Hampshire Student Recycler of the Year.

This award was presented at the NRRA School CLUB's 5th Annual School Recycling Conference and Expo on June 10th at the Radisson Hotel in Manchester, NH.
